# MINUTES FOR THE CLINTON COUNTY COUNCIL MEETING AUGUST 13, 2018 2019

The Clinton County Council met in the Commissioner's Meeting Room at the Clinton County Courthouse, Frankfort, Indiana on August 13, 2018 at the hour of 9:00 a.m. regular Council meeting, pursuant in accordance with law and publication as evidence by proof of the minutes of the last meeting, and any other business that may come before it. Council President Alan Dunn called the meeting to order and led the Pledge of Allegiance. On call to order the following members were shown to be present or absent.

Britt Ostler, Clinton County Auditor, was present to record the proceedings of the Council.

Council member Beard moved seconded by Council member Myers to approve the minutes of the July 9, 2019 meeting. Motion carried 7-0.

#### **COMMUNITY CORRECTIONS**

Community Corrections Director Brett Barton stated there were 85 clients on electronic monitoring in July 2019 with 4 of those being juveniles and 4 on CTP. New vendor for monitoring equipment will be switched in the next 30 days. Field officers will be trained to become special deputies.

## **PROBATION**

Chief Probation Officer Nancy Ward reported juvenile detention costs in the amount of \$0 for the month of July 2019. SRS is the new program they are using in an effort to go paperless. The TRECS program has collected \$6000 from this program. They have received Indiana Office of Court Services Grant for \$1500 used for tangible awards.

### **EXTENSION OFFICE**

Esmeralda Cruz spoke regarding Youth Rise Grant (teen pregnancy prevention) Program. Teachers reached out to look for boundaries for teen sexual education. In 2015, the pregnancy level was 46 per 1000; in 2018, the level is at 24 per 1000 of teen pregnancies. Esmeralda has personally had 80 families go through the program and has not have one family regret taking the class.

Brass Group Leadership Program (youth learning from public officials) 12 students in a 30 hour program.

FAFSA night for families with students heading to college. 40-60 families are helped each year to submit FAFSA. 21st Century Grant 80-120 families are helped each year to apply for Grant. Scholar Track Program is to fulfill criteria set forth by the State. She is planning an event to help students with this grant.

Education after High School Program - 25 students completed the program this year. College visits were included in this program along with life skills such as changing oil; opening bank accounts; making resumes and applying for college.

## LIBRARY BOARD

Phoebe Smith would like to step down from the Library Board. Gregg Williamson would like to appoint Mr. Michael Brackett with the approval of the Council.

Motion made by Council member Hensley seconded by Council member Gascho to appoint Michael Brackett to the Library Board. Motion carried 7-0.

### **NEW BUSINESS**

One80 Resource Recovery's, Rich Reck, spoke regarding the programs goals. The City has contributed \$100,000. Construction of the One80 facility for men is a faith-based program; sober-living home community with mental health counselors. Most incarcerations are for alcohol and drugs and this facility will help recovery and getting back into the community. Residents will be employed by local businesses such as NHK and Coomer Sawmill. The One80 facility will receive residents from other counties. Recovery increases the men's chances of job stability. The facility will be located on 200 West just outside of Frankfort. The program will range from 9-12 months. Asking for financial commitment from City and County.

Motion by Council member Hensley seconded by Council member Gascho to donate \$50,000 to One80 Recovery Resources. Motion carried 7-0.
